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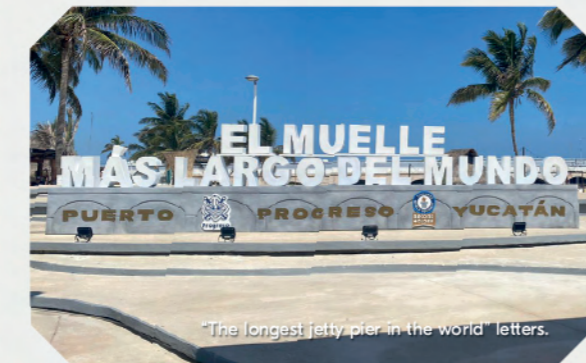
ATTRACTIONS IN PROGRESO AREA:

The longest jetty pier in the world.

Distance from the port: 4.6 Miles (15 min)

As part of the 152nd anniversary of Progreso as a city, the port has received the certification from Guinness World Records for having the World's Largest Jetty-Pier spanning 8,018.98 lineal meters (26,308.72 ft). "El muelle más largo del mundo" photo stop (The longest pier of the world) on the Traditional Malecon next to the pier itself was set to all tourism to take photographs.

The first wooden pier of the Port of Progreso was built in 1872, the pier with modern construction materials was built between 1937 and 1941. Finally the last part of the pier was constructed between 1985 and 1989.



Traditional Malecon

Distance from the port: 4.3 Miles (15 min)
Open to the public.

Walk along this boardwalk and enjoy a famed beachfront pedestrian-only street called Malecon, where you can walk and experience the nice summer weather all year long. Stop at one of its restaurants and have a cold drink while tasting the local dishes. This Traditional Malecon has all the services you can need: restrooms, umbrellas and beach chairs for rentals; as well as banana boat rides, watersport vehicles and massages.

International Malecon

Distance from the port: 5 Miles (15 min)
Open to the public.

This other boardwalk offers a more relaxing area for a nice strolling with its photo stops along its one-mile length. Access to the beach is open and public and has restrooms available and a couple of food trucks.

Meteorite Museum

Distance from the port: 5 Miles (15 min)
Open hours: Tuesday-Sunday, 11 to 19 hrs.

Located in the Traditional Malecon with an amazing waterfront of Progreso, this museum opens Tuesday-Sundays 11-17 hrs. Discover the wonder of stories about the meteorite that hit the planet right in this area and extinct dinosaurs 66 million years ago. Be surprised by animatronic replicas and enjoy walking among dinosaurs.



El Corchito

Distance from the port: 6.1 Miles (19 min)
Open hours: Monday-Sunday, 9 to 17 hrs.

Located less than 6 miles from the Cruise Terminal, and 2 miles from the shuttle stop in downtown Progreso, El Corchito is a wildlife and nature reserve that welcomes visitors into the mangroves iconic of the area and allows you to swim in natural water wells, Ojos de Agua. Spend time among the wild raccoons, coatis, and the many bird species.



Pig Beach

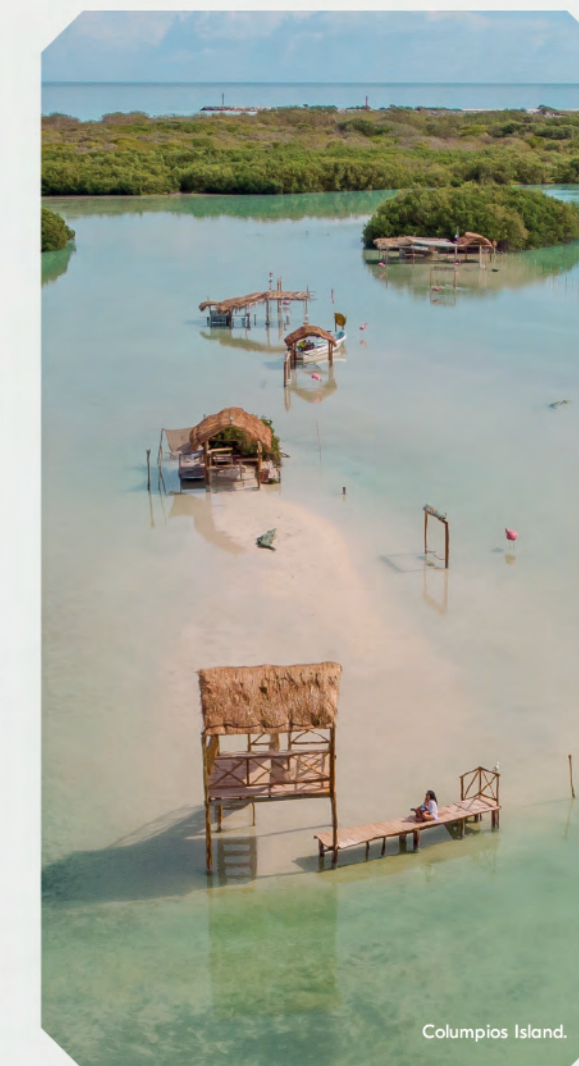
Distance from the port: 9.2 Miles (25 min)
Open hours: Monday-Sunday, 9 to 17 hrs.

As the story of the attraction goes, 6 Vietnamese piglets were found abandoned and in poor condition on or near the beach, and subsequently rescued by the Progreso's municipal Ecological Police. Since then, Progreso has welcomed and, with the creation of their own private beach, afforded them a safe and stable environment in a place where they are appreciated by thousands of visitors who value the work done by those who care for them. Located 20 minutes from the port, Pig Beach is open from 8 am to 6 pm. Access to the beach is free and there are toilets and showers available, as well as snack bars and a souvenir shop where visitors can spend a pleasant day.

Columpios Island

Distance from the port: 20.5 Miles (45 min)
Open hours: Monday-Sunday, 5 to 19 hrs.

Welcome to the stunning new tourist attraction on Yucatan's north coast, just 25 minutes from the Port of Progreso. Prepare to be amazed by its captivating landscape—a collection of small islands, islets, sandbars, and mangroves, embraced by shimmering waters ranging from transparent to turquoise, with hints of mint. Natural channels gracefully distribute the pristine seawater, creating a picturesque setting. Immerse yourself in this aquatic wonderland by swimming, snorkeling, or kayaking through the meandering channels. Discover the vibrant marine life and be enchanted by the beauty beneath the surface. This extraordinary destination offers relaxation and adventure in equal measure, making it a must-visit location for travelers.



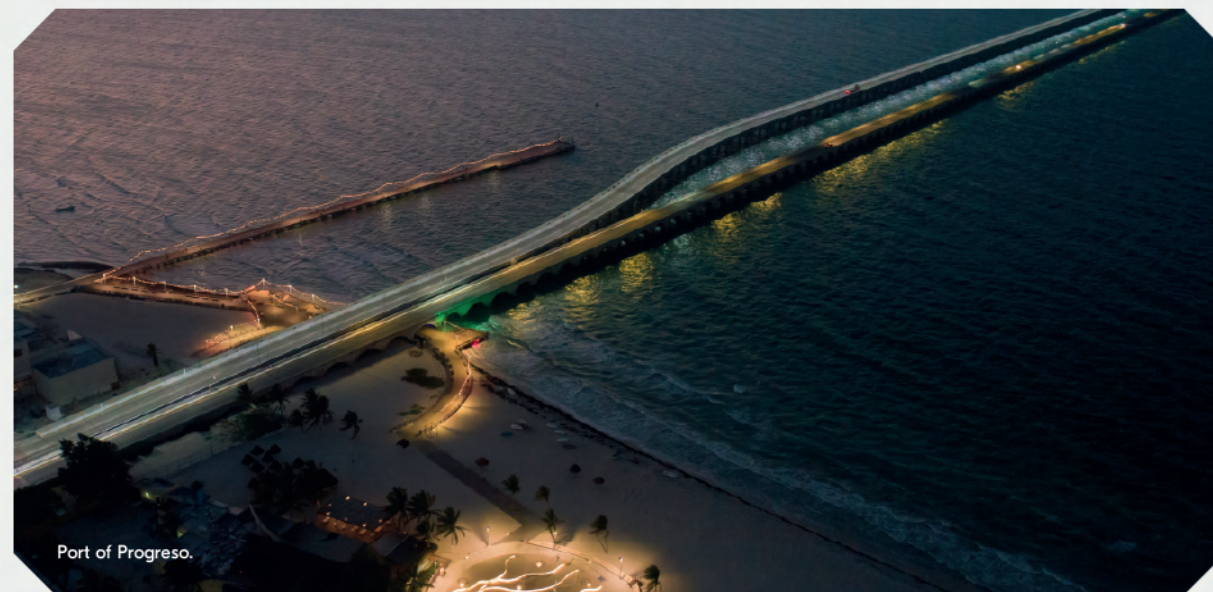
PORT OF PROGRESO

Discover the gateway to the Mayan World at the Port of Progreso, Yucatan's primary maritime hub. Just a stone's throw away from iconic sites like Chichen Itza, Uxmal, and Dzibilchaltun, Progreso is marked by the Chicxulub meteorite crater that played a pivotal role in the extinction of dinosaurs 66 million years ago. Unwind on the pristine emerald beach, where the gentle waves invite you to sit back and relax. Indulge in a delightful dining experience with oceanfront views, savoring the local flavors as you bask in the coastal ambiance. The Port of Progreso beckons you to embark on a journey through time and culture, making it an ideal starting point for your exploration of the Yucatan Peninsula.

CHICXULUB METEORITE IMPACT

Distance from the port: 9.2 Miles (20 min)

The name is the same of the meteorite that hit earth long time ago. The epicenter of the strike is in the water in front of the port with the same name Chicxulub, this quiet fisherman city belongs to Progreso. There are no tourist attractions or activities, except for local restaurants. The meteorite impact formed a mark across the state of Yucatan creating the ring of cenotes. FOOD AND DRINKS

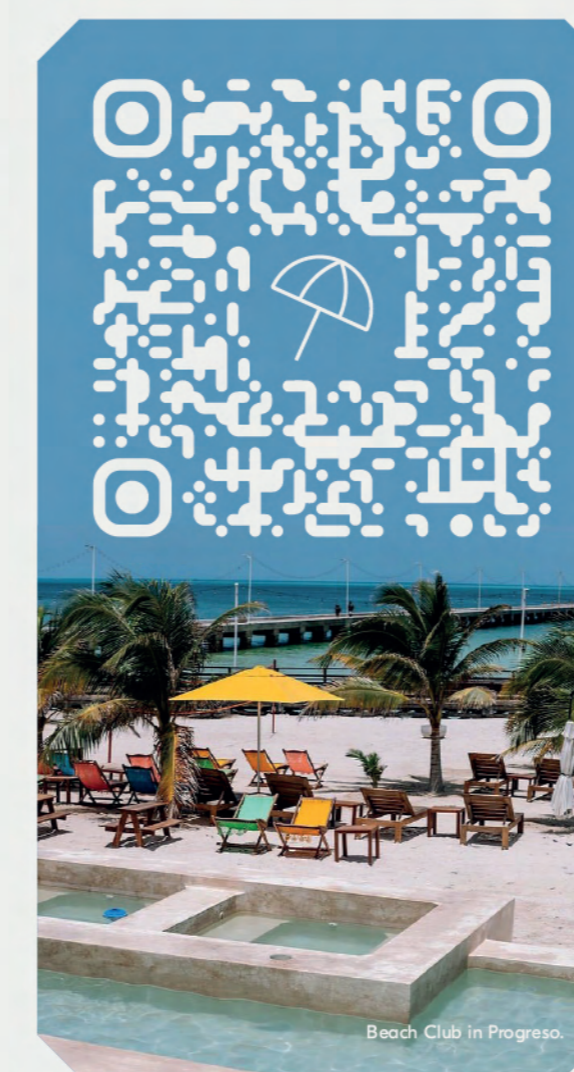

NEARBY PLACES TO VISIT

City of Merida

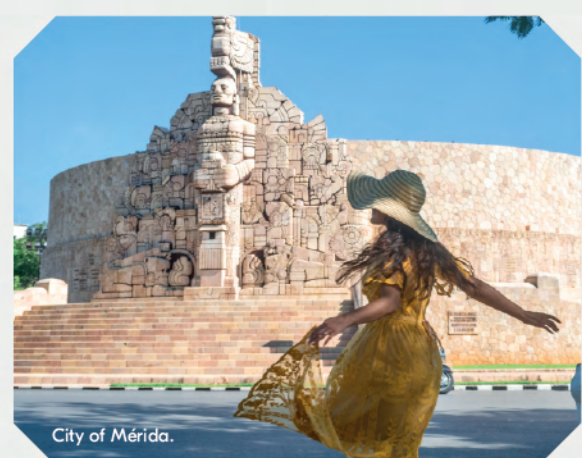
Distance from the port: 28.5 Miles (50 min)

Capital of the state of Yucatan, Merida is a mix of pre and post-colonial and modern styles. Walk down Paseo de Montejo and admire the splendor and richness of the 19th-century architecture, before you reach the downtown and its 15th-century Spanish-built plazas. Visit the iconic San Ildefonso Cathedral, and take a ride on a horse-drawn carriage. Merida also has a wide selection of bars and restaurants, as well as museums and art galleries. In the city, you can find all kinds of fabric, stone, or other kinds of art, from all over the region at one convenient stop.

Great Museum of the Mayan World (GMMM)

Distance from the port: 23.1 Miles (35 min)
Open hours: Wed-Mon 9-17 hrs.

The Great Museum of the Mayan World of Mérida is dedicated to disseminating, promoting and strengthening Mayan identity and culture through projects and programs that promote knowledge, valuation and appreciation of the heritage and historical cultural heritage of the Mayab. It is a living, inclusive space for meeting and interaction that synthesizes memory and creativity, tradition and modernity and in which the conservation and recreation of the material and immaterial testimonies of the Mayan people of yesterday and today is encouraged through its exhibitions.



Chichen Itza

Distance from the port: 109.3 Miles (2 hrs)
Open hours: Mon-Sun 8-16 hrs.

A magical archeological site, named by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site, is located about 2 hours away from the Port of Progreso. Famous for the snake shadow, Kukulcan, that climbs down the main pyramid twice a year during the summer and winter solstice. Other notable structures are the Mayan Ball Game Court—the largest in the region—and the Temple of the Warriors, also known as the Platform of the Skulls. While an impressive sight, distance and limited time can be an obstacle to visiting Chichen Itza. Remember to start your journey as early as possible.



Mayapan

Distance from the port: 62.1 Miles (1 hr 15 min)
Open hours: Mon-Sun 8-16 hrs.

The walled city of Mayapan, known as 'Flag of the Mayans', is considered the last great Mayan capital. It was the headquarters of 'The League of Mayapan', a confederation that brought together the chiefs of Uxmal and Chichén Itzá. It was built in the likeness of Chichen Itza. Its main buildings are a copy of the capital of the Itzaes. The construction style incorporated elements typical of the architecture of Central Mexico, combined with features inherited from the ancient Mayan cities. It is located south of the State of Yucatan, at 62 miles from the Port of Progreso.



Xcambo

Distance from the port: 29 Miles (45 min)
Open hours: Mon-Sun 8-16 hrs.

Located 23 miles from Progreso, Xcambo is in the perfect location to experience a little of everything Yucatan has to offer, combining this Mayan archeological site with the opportunity for a Flamingo sighting. Due to its proximity to the beachside, this is a good place to visit and still have time to spend in Port of Progreso or other beach spots.



Dzibilchaltun

Distance from the port: 20.9 Miles (30 min)
Open hours: Mon-Sun 8-16 hrs.

Less than 20 miles or half-hour away, Dzibilchaltun is the closest Mayan site to visit from the Progreso Cruise Terminal. Open to the public from 8 am to 5 pm, and halfway between the port and the City of Merida, it remains a most convenient stop when immersing yourself in the local history and culture.
